

Caracas

Passengers at the largest international airport in Venezuela are now being charged for the right to breathe clean air. According to officials at Simon Bolívar International Airport – aka Maiquetía – near Caracas, the \$20 surcharge is designed to cover the cost of using ozone to purify the air piped into the terminal, a system that eliminates bacterial growth and “deodorizes and sanitises” the building. However, this explanation provoked fury and ridicule on social media. “Could you explain to me the ozone thing in Maiquetía?” tweeted radio presenter Daniel Martínez. “The toilets don’t have water, the air-con is broken, there are stray dogs inside the airport, but there’s ozone?”
